

Person County

North Carolina has a long and rich history in public library service and in support of education and lifelong learning. Libraries were often the product of public service groups within the community. The Thornton Library in Granville County was the outgrowth of the Women's Service Association, while others grew out of local school boards, home demonstration clubs, and church groups. The Home Demonstration clubs were started in 1913 and have evolved into what is now known as the NC ECA.

In the mid-20th century, many home demonstration clubs adopted the practice of reading and discussing books recommended by the state librarian. Members who read a certain number of books from the librarian's list received a certificate from the state. Without local libraries, the books had to be shipped from Raleigh to the county Extension offices. Members began to see the need for a local source for books in their counties, and many clubs were instrumental in raising funds for county libraries and bookmobiles — libraries on wheels. By the mid-1950s, North Carolina led the

country in bookmobile service, with 101 bookmobiles serving 94 counties.



Therefore, on Tuesday, July 3rd, the **Person County ECA** donated \$1000 to the Person County Library to help fund their purchase of a new bookmobile to help provide books to even more people across Person County. The ECA County Council decided to help support the Person County Library because many of the members remember the "traveling library" when they were children which brought new books each month out to all parts of the county, providing education and satisfaction to the entire community.
